

ADVISORS TO THE BOARD OF EDUCATION AND BOARD OF EDUCATION ADVISORY COMMITTEES

The Board of Education may appoint citizen advisory committees whenever it determines the formation of such committees is in the best interest of the school district. Such committees shall serve at the pleasure of the Board and, unless specifically charged with a continuing function, shall be considered discharged when the relevant reports, statements, or recommendations have been made. The Board shall consider and, within a reasonable time, respond to the recommendations offered by such committees but must reserve ultimate decisions to its own best judgment.

The Board of Education may invite any person or persons who are particularly qualified through training, experience, or personal characteristics to act as advisors to the Board individually or in groups when it determines that this might lead to the betterment of the Sharon Springs Central School District.

A Site-Based Committee was established by the Sharon Springs Central School Board of Education in September 1993. The purpose of this committee is to improve the educational performance of all students in the school, regardless of such factors as socioeconomic status, race, gender, language, or disability.
