## COLLEGE COURSES FOR SCHOOL CREDIT

All high school students who are planning to enroll in a college course(s) and desire school credit(s) shall have the Principal and Guidance Counselor review and give approval before enrollment. Courses must be taken from an accredited college or university that the student attends on campus or receives online.

Credit shall not be granted unless approval has been obtained previous to enrollment.

One half unit of school credit shall be granted for each approved (3) credit college course completed or one (1) high school credit, six (6) college credits. (Credits will be pro-rated as needed)

For class rank purposes the final grades for college courses will be weighted by multiplying the final grade by 1.1. For example if the final grade is a B (which converts to 86.00), 86 will be multiplied by 1.1 which equals 94.60. The school grade would then be 94.60. Regents grades are also weighted the same way when calculating class ranks.

The following conversion scale shall be used to covert a letter grade to a numerical grade for local school purposes.
